Mr. Al Gombos asked that Mr. John Wilson include a memo stating his recommendation to approve this service agreement, he also asked if there were any stipulations in the Agreement regarding the limitation on water consumption by Sutter. Mr. Jim Simplon said that no, there were no stipulations, and Mr. John Wilson explained that there are no capacity issues where Sutter Services is concerned. Mr. Al Gobos then asked what if someone like a Gulfport needed all of the available water, is HCUA obligated to provide water to Sutter Services? Mr. Jim Simpson explained that we were under no obligation to provide within this contract.

Supervisor Marlin Ladner then asked if HCUA has any other Private Certificated areas that we have similar agreements with. Mr. John Wilson told him that yes, we do, West Harrison Water & Sewer District, and East Central Harrison County Utiluty District, and that we have discussed options with Great River Utilities and some other smaller systems. Supervisor Ladner then asked what rate Sutter Services was being charged, Mr. Wilson told him that they pay \$2.30/thousand gallons, which is more than West Harrison or ECHPUD, who receive the same "member" rate that the Cities and County pay (\$1.25/thousand gallons).
