
HCUA PRAISES FRONTLINE WORKERS

With many families at home from school or work due to COVID-19, HCUA households saw an increase in garbage, yard waste and recycling over the past months. Our Waste Management team combined with our partner Pelican Waste & Debris to work tirelessly as essential workers during the pandemic to ensure there were no issues with service during this time. We can't thank our team enough for all of their dedication and hard work during this highly stressful time.

INCREASED TONNAGE DURING PANDEMIC

Looking at April and May, HCUA saw significant increases in all three areas of collections. April had the highest rates of FY20 with 4,053.95 tons of garbage, 2,662.03 tons of yard waste and 396.37 tons of recycling collecting during that month. May was not far behind as it posted the second-highest rates of the fiscal year so far with 3,916.75 tons of garbage, 2,654.19 tons of yard waste and 369.86 tons of recycling collected. Not only are the two months the highest numbers for FY20, take a look at the graph below to see the comparison to the last fiscal year.

WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

There are a number of easy ways to save water, & they all start with YOU. When you save water, you save money on your utility bills. Here are just a few ways...

- Shorten your shower by a minute or two and you'll save up to 150 gallons per month.
- Check all waterline connections and faucets for leaks. A slow drip can waste as much as 170 gallons of water EACH DAY, or 5,000 gallons per month, and will add to the water bill.
- Use your clothes washer and dishwasher only when they are full. This will save up to 1,000 gallons a month.
- Turn off the water while brushing your teeth and save 25 gallons a month.
